MYAAMIA ARTS GRANT PROGRAM

Call for Proposal 2014:

The Myaamia Arts Grant Program supports community artists in both the creation of new art forms and the preservation of traditional crafts and skills. This program encourages artists to use Myaamia aesthetic designs in contemporary art forms and products that will be of interest to a broader tribal community. We also support the direct preservation and teaching of traditional art forms that can be directly linked to pre-20th century crafts and skills. Projects or programs designed to revitalize currently or near dormant art forms or crafts must provide verifiable historical documentation in the application that the activity is a traditional Myaamia art/craft.

Appropriate expenses include travel, equipment, consultant fees (especially for elders), materials, etc. We do not fund overhead costs. If you have questions regarding allowable expenses, please contact the foundation's executive director. These grants are typically 1-2 year projects, although extensions are possible, and should range between \$2,000 and \$10,000.

Eligibility:

Must be enrolled members of the Miami Tribe of Oklahoma or the Miami Nation of Indiana. Proof of enrollment is required.

Deadline:

Submit all applications in PDF format by midnight January 1, 2014.

How to Apply:

Please use the Grant Application and Outline Form to prepare your proposal. Feel free to expand on the application as needed for your individual project or program. When finished, email the application in PDF format to **ExecutiveDirector@myaamiafoundation.org**. A confirmation email will be sent to you after the application is received and reviewed for completeness. Incomplete applications will be returned with comments.
